

This week, we will have a panel discussion about Christian community in our weekend services, and small groups will feature heavily in our discussion. The questions that follow are meant to help small groups think through WHY you do what you do. I hope your group's conversation is fruitful, and this helps you and your group engage with each other more deeply as you spur each other on in Christ-likeness.

1. The message this weekend opens with a discussion of Acts 2:42-47. Please read this passage together as a group. Discuss how your small group engages in the types of activities that we read about in this passage. Are there any of the activities that your group doesn't participate in? Why do you think this is the case?
2. How does Christian community look different today than it did 2000 years ago when the above passage was written? What elements are still the same?
3. Take a few minutes to discuss among your group how each of you have been impacted by Christian community... especially through small groups (either your current group, or a past group).
4. What are the primary focuses of your group? How do these match up with the discussion from this weekend about what a small group ought to focus on?
5. We closed the message discussion one on one discipleship. How many people in your group are also involved in one-on-one discipleship. For those that are not, consider taking the step with others in your group to intentionally meet one on one for peer discipleship.
