

Read Acts 10:1-48

Transition is defined as "the process or a period of changing from one state or condition to another." As we see this demonstrated in music, we also see in the book of Acts how the process of transition is part of the **progressive revelation** of God throughout His word. What are some of the remarkable transitions (hard or happy) that you have experienced in your life?

You can trace the flow of transition described in Acts 1:8 throughout the book of Acts. What are some instances of transition (people, geography, etc.) that you remember occurring in the previous chapters in Acts (1-9)?

Where do Cornelius and his family fit on the progressive scale of believers in Jesus? In other word, how are they alike/different from Peter and other converts we see in Acts? How are you like other converts in Acts? Where do you fit on the progressive scale of characters you see in Acts?

What is fundamentally different about Peter's message to Cornelius in 10:34-43 than other sermons you read in Acts? Why do you think this is so? What is the essential message of every sermon in Acts that does not change?
