

Keep Calm and Praise the Lord

Psalm 134

And here, finally, we deal with the call to praise the Lord. When our worship is appropriately applied, panic subsides and the peace of Christ can rule and guard our hearts.

1. In verse 1, the designation “servants of the Lord” was addressed to whom? They are exhorted to fill the night with prayer as well as watchfulness, and to let their hearts go up in blessing to Yahweh. What clues can we gain from (Leviticus 6:8-13; 1 Chronicles 9:2-33) or the remaining question?
2. To whom was verse 3 addressed? What does the phrase “the Lord” indicate? Why is this important?
3. Some Bible versions use Zion in the phrase, “bless you from Zion”, where is Zion?
4. How can we give praise? Read (Ps 9:1; 146:1-2; 103:2; Hos. 14:2; Eph. 2:8-9; Heb. 13:15)?
5. How can we worship and appropriately apply, read (Ex. 3:5; Lev. 7:37-38; Nu. 28:1-2; Psa. 81:1-3; Matt. 2:11; 17:5; 1 Cor. 14:26)?
6. How can our worship be appropriately applied so that panic subsides and the peace of Christ can rule?
